Sensei Leigh believes: 'If you are in danger and under attack you panic but with your Karate training, you can learn to think in a new and controlled way; avoiding conflict completely or defending yourselves from attack.' Sensei Leigh is closely involved with local schools in Manchester and fully supportive of anti bullying strategies of all descriptions.
