This is exactly what a group of first century men did over, 2,000 years ago – we know them as the Magi, wise men or kings:

"In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." Mathew Chapter 2

The Magi, who studied the stars and planets in the sky, are reported to have followed a particular star which led them to Jesus. They had no map or route to follow, they were moving as the star led, according to their studies, beliefs and faith.

The Magi were dedicated, probably leaving their families, setting off on a journey to an unknown destination. On their journey they must have passed through both deserts and oasis's.

It is often like this for us in life. We see a glimmer of God's existence, see a sign or have a Word from God; we have dreams that we would like to see fulfilled, but we do not know where or how to start.
