## Tearfund Urge Pembrokeshire to *Make Life Flow*

1. Right now, one in three people around the world do not have anywhere decent to go to the toilet. For one in six a glass of clean water is an unimaginable luxury. Tearfund believe it's time to put an end to this injustice and have launched a new *Make Life Flow* Campaign.

"Shockingly almost 900 million people are without access to clean water. Everyday 5,000 children under 5 die needlessly from diarrhoeal diseases caused by dirty water. While over 2.5 billion are without a clean and safe place to go to the loo." says Tearfund's Sharron Hardwick.

In 2000, world leaders signed up to the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), targets that could transform the lives of millions around the world. With 7 years until targets are meant to be met, slow progress on water and sanitation is the most off track by more than 80 years.

As well as joining campaigners from organisations like *Water Aid*, the *British Medical Association* and *WWF* to form *End Water Poverty* an international coalition; Tearfund have launched their *Make Life Flow* campaign to challenge those with the power to prioritise water and sanitation. Over the next few years, Tearfund want to mobilise thousands of Christians to stand up and demand extraordinary action from decision makers. They urge the people of Pembrokeshire to join their mission:
